FIRST IN THE REGION: UMC RECEIVES MEMBERSHIP INTO THE SOCIETY FOR VASCULAR SURGERY VQI REGISTRY

El PASO, Texas – The University Medical Center of El Paso Healthcare Partners

Vascular and Endovascular Surgery Center has received notification of its

membership into the Society for Vascular Surgery VQI (Vascular Quality Initiative)

Registry; a first for the region. The center is led by Gilbert Aidinian, M.D., Division

Chief of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery for UMC and Texas Tech Physicians of

El Paso (TTP El Paso). Dr. Aidinian is also an associate professor at Texas Tech

University Health Sciences Center El Paso's Foster School of Medicine.

"It is with great joy I announce UMC is now part of the Society for Vascular Surgery VQI (Vascular Quality Initiative) Registry," said Dr. Aidinian. "This is a great leap for UMC and TTP EI Paso Vascular Surgery, since we are now part of the 945 participating centers in this registry and first in the region.
