Associates' Questions Open Discussion At Coffee With The CEO

Each month, Associates are randomly chosen to spend an hour with Jacob Cintron, President & CEO, during a light breakfast and coffee/juice in the UMC Boardroom. We want to share some of their questions with Pulse readers, along with Jacob's responses. (Note: Questions and answers are edited for brevity.)

Q. Will the new UMC Central Clinic have a pharmacy?

A. Yes. Our new UMC Central Clinic will be located at the site of the old Vagabond Hotel, near the corner of Raynolds and I-10. It is also the same area that some may recall once was home to an Arby's restaurant. However, we are looking at many options for the clinic, such as specialty clinics and perhaps, leasing out some of the space.

Q. What can be done to reduce the wait time and processing for calls/scheduling appointments?

A. This is a priority for us. We are having issues with scheduling that we are fixing. Our customers are not going to wait for us when they can simply hang up and go to another hospital. Some of the options we are looking at include changes to staffing levels and/or outsourcing some of our call volume. Again, this is something that affects our business and we want our patients to know that we value their time by expediently responding to their calls.

Q. How can we improve the radio frequency for our security team to ensure clear communication with staff from anywhere on campus?

A. Thank you for bringing this up. Making sure that our Guest Services Security team is able to contact or be contacted at any time is extremely important to the effectiveness of their duties. We have reached out to Pat Valdez-Rios, Assistant Administrator for Support Services, who will look at options, such as increasing the number of frequency repeaters throughout the hospital. Regardless, we will get this fixed.

Q. Can we look at replacing the logos and vehicle signage wraps for all of our vehicles?

A. Yes, that is great idea. Our Public Affairs office is currently coordinating with our Guest Services team to revamp and redesign all of our vehicle wraps to ensure they are consistent and, if needed, replaced.

Q. Can we look at adding rehab services to our UMC East Clinic?

A. That is one of the options we are looking at. East El Paso is growing faster than many of our city planners imagined. For us, that means ensuring we are providing enough access to high quality healthcare for El Pasoans. Our UMC East Clinic is an option but we are also looking at expanding our footprint here, at the main campus as well as yet another or expanded presence in east El Paso.

Q. Is UMC ever going to expand mental health services?

A. Yes. This is another area that we are looking to add more attention to meet our needs, such as a much larger area and presence to ensure quality care for patients who need it, when they need it. We are also considering hiring a fulltime counselor, onsite.

Q. Can something be done to energize the golf cart that was once used by Security to travel throughout the campus?

A. Yes. Our Public Affairs office discussed this issue with Guest Services and they are looking into ways to get the golf cart operational again. Thanks for bringing this up!
