








Art Compean Retires With Nearly 50 Years Of Service



Pending Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approval for the Pfizer and/or Moderna vaccine, UMC is moving forward in preparation to administer the COVID-19 booster shot to its Associates. Here is some helpful information:

- Our anticipated date for the COVID-19 booster shot is during the week of Sept. 27.
- The COVID-19 booster shot will be administered on Monday, Sept.
 through Wednesday, Sept. 29, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the UMC

Cafeteria. The flu shot also will be administered on Thursday, Sept. 30 and Friday, Oct. 1, from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the UMC Cafeteria.

- UMC Associates will also be able to receive first or second doses of the COVID-19 vaccine during this time.
- UMC Associates who work in the UMC Clinics and Correctional Health locations will receive their COVID-19 booster shots and flu shots at their respective areas during the week of October 4.
- Consent and pre-registrations forms have been emailed to all UMC Associates. Please bring your Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) vaccination card. Information on replacement cards has been emailed to all UMC Associates.
