For Some, It's Déjà vu; For East El Paso, It's A Celebration

When UMC and community leaders gathered at the site of construction of a new emergency department next to UMC East on March 15, some might have had a sense of déjà vu, that they had previously experienced the same event. In some ways, they did – same speakers, same setup but different dirt – at an event two weeks prior.

Many others, however, saw the newly broken ground next to UMC East as a cause for celebration that the growing need for better healthcare on El Paso's east side is going to be met by UMC, El Paso's most advanced hospital. More than 160,000 residents of east El Paso will later this year have 24/7 access to emergency care as construction ramps up after a March 15 groundbreaking ceremony next to the UMC East Clinic.



As they did with a similar ceremony earlier in March, community leaders, UMC’s board, administration leaders and Associates took part in the ceremony on a windswept and cold Friday afternoon. This second groundbreaking solidifies for the first time in our region’s history, El Paso County will own and operate two full-service offsite emergency departments away from UMC’s main campus.

The new emergency department will be attached to the UMC East facility located at 1521 Joe Battle. Both the new Northeast and East Emergency Departments are scheduled to open later this year.
